R/V *Hihimanu* joined the Office of National Marine Sanctuaries Pacific Islands Region's fleet, as the second boat for the Papahānaumokuākea Marine National Monument (PMNM), the first since PMNM's designation. The 11-meter (36-foot) R/V *Hīhīmanu* augments the PMNM small boat complement, significantly expands the Monument's seagoing capabilities. She also serves as a platform for the Hawaiian Islands Humpback Whale National Marine Sanctuary on Maui where she is used for disentanglement and ship-strike response, tagging, observation, and health assessment of whales. The boat's elevated remote helm provides excellent visibility for safe operation around whales.

R/V *Hīhīmanu's* primary mission is research and conservation. Other key missions are local research dives on various islands with other agencies, and proficiency skills testing. When not in Maui, R/V *Hīhīmanu* is home ported on O'ahu allowing for servicing, and other projects to be completed around the island. R/V *Hihimanu* is a flexible platform for the Monument that allows it to be used for a wide variety of missions and partnerships as they develop statewide.

Built by Silver Ships, Inc. in Theodore, AL, this AMBAR-class vessel has an aluminum hull and wheelhouse, collared with a foam-filled inflatable chamber making it ideal for operating around ships and piers. The enclosed cabin provides protection from the elements during interisland crossings, and allows for the dry transport of gear and personnel.
